NEW RANKINGS PUT THE UNIVERSITY OF THE WEST INDIES AMONG TOP 5 PERCENT OF BEST UNIVERSITIES IN THE WORLD

UWI, Marketing, Recruitment and Communication Office September 28, 2018

September 28, 2018 The University of the West Indies (The UWI) has broken into the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings for the first time. The 2019 Times Higher Education World University Rankings has ranked The UWI among the world's top institutions. The rankings show that The UWI is located among the 1,258 top universities in world for 2019. This puts The UWI in the elite band of



the top 5% of universities worldwide based on data showing that there are over 25,000 recognised universities, globally. Specifically, Times Higher Education ranked The UWI at 591 out of the 1,258 universities which made the list. The UWI is the only Caribbean institution on the world-wide list. It was also the only Caribbean university ranked earlier this year in THE's 2018 Latin America University Rankings, in the region that is home to over 100 universities contributing to sustainable development.

In 2015, when Vice-Chancellor Professor Sir Hilary Beckles took over the reins, he declared an intention to radically globalise the University and to prepare it for regional and global comparisons within the THE's rankings. This required the considerable mobilising of the evidence relevant to its academic legacy and current strategic agenda as a strategic project. Vice-Chancellor Beckles, in establishing an Office for Global Affairs, and giving a remit to the redesigned Office of Strategic Planning, recognised the need for The UWI to be competitive internationally within a global sector. The Vice-Chancellor's vision to have The UWI recognised within the top 5% of the best universities in the world has now been realised.

Elated about the news, Vice-Chancellor Beckles said, "The excellence of The UWI has been a well-kept secret for far too long. Now, with these very impressive global ranking results, we can begin to share with the world the story of this academic enterprise in the West Indies that highlights the intellectual achievement and scholastic contributions of the Caribbean community."

Regarded as the definitive list of the top universities, THE's World University Rankings is the only global university performance table to judge research-intensive universities across their core missions of teaching (the learning environment); research (volume, income and reputation), international outlook (staff, students and research); citations (research influence); industry income (knowledge transfer). The 70-year-old regional university, which is relatively young among its counterparts in the World Rankings, scored in the top 10% of universities (#290) for its international outlook and in the top 30% (#370) for research influence.

The UWI's exceptional performance in the 2018 Latin America University Rankings and now the 2019 World University Rankings demonstrates a series of deliberate strategic initiatives advanced by the implementation of the University's five-year strategic plan for 2017-2022. Themed the Triple A Strategy, the plan is centred around widening Access to quality tertiary education, greater Alignment of The UWI with academic-industry partnerships relevant to the region's needs and Agility and alertness in engaging global connections and possibilities.

The Westwood High School Alumni group, which comprises, S. Fl. Chapter Westwood Old Girls Association, Inc (SFCWOGA), WOGA JAMAICA and, WOGA NEW YORK (WOGA NY) will be presenting a forum on trafficking in person (TIP) under the theme "Understanding Human Trafficking" on Thursday, November 15th, 2018, 6 pm - 9 pm, at the Holy Family Episcopal Church Hall, in Miami Gardens, Florida, USA, hosted by Father Horace Ward, Rector, which seeks to educate & empower the community about Human Trafficking, provide examples of resources available and highlight ways to recognize contributory/related activities, while exposing participants to the reality of a victim and survivor. Statistics of the South Florida involvement will be available.

The forum will take the form of a panel discussion with a question/answer session after. Specific persons will also speak from the floor. We plan on having an ongoing conversation on this topic.

We are also collaborating with the LASCO Chin Foundation (LCF) in hosting this forum. The LCF is a recently established foundation with a mission of early intervention to help Jamaica's at-risk youths develop the relationships, goals and capacities needed to break the cycle of poverty and crime and become productive members of society, especially as successful entrepreneurs. The core activities of the LCF are related to the implementation of a Sustainable Socio-Economic Intervention (SSI) model that relies on effective local and international partnerships to improve outcomes for the most disadvantaged youths over the long-term.

We therefore all inviting all alumni, families and friends to attend this forum, which is free to all attendees. We will share information about Jamaica's role on an international level.

FOUR NEW INDUCTEES FOR STGC HALL OF FAME

FOUR St George's College past students were last Saturday inducted into the school's prestigious Hall of Fame at its biennial induction banquet at The Worthington, Spanish Court Hotel in New Kingston. The evening started with cocktails, as approximately

350 guests streamed into the banquet hall, among them former Prime Minister Bruce Golding and Minister of Health, Dr Christopher Tufton. Emcee and organising committee member, Paul Bitter, ably navigated the programme, bringing good humour to the audience.

Chairman of the Hall of Fame organising committee, Donovan Chen, explained that "since 2000, it has become our tradition that once every two years, we gather as a family to recognise and honour a small number of our brothers who have made a difference by demonstrating community spirit, excellence and achievement in a particular field, inspiring leadership; national and/or international recognition, vision and innovation and service to the college", which earns them a permanent place in the Hall of Fame room at the institution.

This year's inductees are successful entrepreneur Phillip Wong, from the class of 1959; celebrated scholar of Caribbean history Robert Hill, also from the class of 1959; retired corporate banker Clovis 'Metty' Metcalfe, from the class of 1961; and Howard Mitchell, who is from the class of 1967, an attorney-at-law, businessman and the incumbent president of the Private Sector Organisation of Jamaica.

- Wong, who was born in Tahiti to a Jamaican father, was recognised for his generous contributions, including nine scholarships and other major school restoration and redevelopment projects at St George's College. In his citation, attorney-at-law and scholarship recipient Jezeel Martin described Wong as one who has been "driven by a spirit of philanthropy, making a difference in the lives of those who have not known good fortune".
- **Metcalfe** was hailed by his fellow old boy, Winston Millwood, for "his outgoing manner, good sense of humour and pleasant demeanour", which came to the attention of his peers early during his schools days, when he was selected as 'Campus Personality', which was published in the *Blue and White* magazine in 1961.
- Hill, who was a 1992 Gold Medal recipient of a Musgrave Medal from the Institute of Jamaica for distinguished contribution to history, was acknowledged by his peers as one of the world's foremost authorities on Jamaica's National Hero Marcus Garvey, and served as historical advisor to the Government on the Marcus Garvey Centenary Committee.

• Mitchell was recognised for his community spirit, excellence and achievement in business, inspiring leadership, national recognition, and service to the school.

The evening also saw the presentation of contributions to the school's Endowment Fund. Chen noted that past students had been able to "move the fund from 100 million Jamaican dollars, to over \$220 million, and the target of \$300 million is now on the horizon". He also noted that the school has made academic improvements over the years.

"The 2018 academic report is out, and I believe that since we turn the corner in 2004, we have made steady progress. In the 2018 CSEC (Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate) results, St George's College is now the second-best-rated all boys school," Chen said.

Proceeds from the Hall of Fame Induction Banquet go towards assisting St George's College students with school expenses.

KNOCKALVA AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL NOW A POLYTECHNIC COLLEGE

The Knockalva Agricultural School is now a polytechnic college, providing greater access to tertiary education for persons in western Jamaica. Minister of Education, Youth and Information Ruel Reid noted that the rebranded institution, located in Hanover, will bring tertiary studies to the doorsteps of residents of the parish in addition to St James and Westmoreland.

"We cannot have all our colleges and universities in Kingston and St Andrew. We don't have enough space, and more so, education and training systems are changing so rapidly that even in your living room, you can access certain programmes. So, we have to bring education and training as close to our people as possible," said Reid. He was speaking at a ceremony to officially launch the 2018-2019 school year and mark the new Knockalva Polytechnic College on Thursday on the grounds of the institution in Ramble.

Earlier this year, the education minister said that the institution "fits very neatly in our K (kindergarten) to 18 strategy".

"It is now viewed as a post-secondary [institution], and it needs to be reclassified and upgraded to become a full polytechnic as we have done with the Trench Town Polytechnic. That will attract tertiary-level programmes so that the students can achieve better certification and be better aligned to industry," he further pointed out.

The official launch of the school year was held under the theme 'Ramp It Up or Fix it Up; K to 13 ... An Inclusive Education System'. Reid lauded the collaboration between the ministries of transport and mining and labour and social security to implement the rural bus system in 12 parishes.

The bus system is intended to provide affordable transportation for students and improve school attendance in rural areas.


