## MOUNT ALVERNIA HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION (CENTRAL FLORIDA): VOLUNTEERISM BASED ON COMMITMENT, CONSISTENCY, AND LOVE FOR MANKIND

Over the past two years the Central Florida Chapter of Mount Alvernia High School Alumni Association has made significant contributions to their alma mater, Jamaica, South Florida and others in need. We agree with the president Dawn Chin Jones who notes the *'indescribable joy and satisfaction from giving because of the lives that change, the dreams realized, and the hope restored'*. We also believe that what the Central Florida Chapter of Mount Alvernia has accomplished in recent years is based on unwavering commitment to their alma mater, consistent and programed effort, and love for mankind.

Here are some highlights of their accomplishments:

- ✚ **"M.A.H.S. first school bus"**. The students and faculty needed a reliable mode of transportation to take them to and from the myriad of school activities in which they participate. MAHS Central Florida made a historical contribution – they delivered and celebrated their 'Drive to Success', their first school bus in the institution's 90 years of existence. On September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019, its own school bus drove through the gates in 'fine style'. This 35-seater, luxury coach bus has the school logo embossed, features plush seats with head rest, a refrigerator. USB ports at each seat, LCD monitors and is Wi-Fi enabled.
- ✚ Funding for the **MAHS Computer Resource Centre** that is now open and fully operational. It is reported that there is 100% daily usage by students and staff from all grade levels.
- ✚ Another very successful **Health Fair** in 2018 in which a team of medical professionals and ancillary volunteers provided health care screenings and information to students and staff. Students are now focused on making healthier food choices and creating a vision board of their own.
- ✚ Launching of the **S.M.R.T. Program** (Self, Motivate & Responsible Teens), an interactive student-centered intervention program geared to supporting young people to develop positive sexual health behaviors. This is a collaboration with the Ministry of Education's health and family life unit. Kudos to alumni member Joy Crawford, Founder of Eve for life program for helping MAHS Central Florida to launch this program and thanks also for her continued support and monitoring of our young sisters that are at risk and those in need of help. The Eve for Life team plays an active role at every health fair hosted by MAHSCFL.
- ✚ **Lunch Program Support and Tuition Assistance** are on-going initiatives of Mount Alvernia High School Alumni Central Florida (MAHS Central Florida). There is also tuition assistance/support for graduates at tertiary institutions.
- ✚ The **Prom Dress Drive** is reported to be one of the most popular programs and it continues to expand, thanks to donations from MAHS Central Florida members and sponsors. Special thanks to "The Belle of the Ball" organization in Clearwater, Florida for their donation of 150 dresses!

✚ **Feeding Program:** MAHS Central Fl. has committed to a partnership with 'The Metropolitan Ministry of Tampa Bay', to break the cycle of hunger among the homeless, unemployed, families with children and elderly struggling with food insecurities, MAHS Central Florida is playing a major role in the local communities in Central Florida.

✚ **Support for the Athletic Programs:** (Swimming, tennis, basketball, netball, football, track and field teams were given water bottles for each team members. Also 14 tennis rackets were donated in October 2018).

✚ **Donations to Health Care:**

- **Medicines & Medical Supplies:** Significant "in-kind" donations were made to the Hope, Seaford Town, and Catherine Hall Type 4 clinics in Jamaica.
- **Cornwall Regional Hospital:** Two (2) Defibrillators, much-needed medical and surgical supplies, Ambu bags (resuscitator bag used to assist ventilation) and medicines were presented to the hospital.
- **Bustamante Children's Hospital:** Pediatric Ambu bags were donated for each ward and the Emergency Rooms.
- **The Savanna-la-mar Hospital** - Donations of much needed medical and surgical supplies. Ambu bags, trach kits, oxygen supplies, dressings, tube feeding bags, syringes and urinary catheters.
- **The Consie Walters Cancer Hospice,** located on the grounds of the St. Joseph's Hospital, on Deanery Road, in Kingston, received ongoing supplies of scissors, gauze, rolls, diapers, bandages, tapes, antibiotic creams and skin care products for wound dressings.





## **DR. RUPERT RHODD AND DR. ALLAN CUNNINGHAM RECEIVE GALLEON COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD.**

On November 1, 2019, at the Galleon Foundation's 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala held at the Renaissance Hotel in Plantation, Dr. Rupert Rhodd and Dr. Allan Cunningham were two of nine recipients of the prestigious Community Service Awards from the Galleon Foundation Inc. This award is given each year to selected individuals who have exemplified themselves as a stalwart in our community.

The Galleon Foundation was founded 10 years ago, with its chief purpose of creating a positive impact by improving the lives of financially disadvantaged children through scholarships and mentorships. To commemorate its tenth anniversary, the Galleon Foundation also awarded six (6) scholarships totaling \$6,000 to high school students in Broward County.

**Dr. Rupert G. Rhodd** is an Associate Dean and an Associate Professor of Economics in the College of Business at Florida Atlantic University. He is a graduate of Central Branch Primary School, Wolmer's Boys' School, the University of the West Indies (BSc. Economics - Honors), and Fordham University in New York [MA (Economics) & PhD (Economics)]. An educator for most of his life, Dr. Rhodd has taught in Jamaica, China, The United States, Panama, and the Bahamas. Before migrating to the United States, Dr. Rhodd taught at Wolmer's Boys' School. He has been employed at Florida Atlantic University since 1989. Dr. Rhodd has also worked as a research economist for the US Army Corp of Engineers in New York.

Dr. Rhodd's research in applied macroeconomics, development economics, international economics and regional economics has been published in numerous academic journals; and he is the author of Bar Charts' Self study guide on International Business, and the Co-author of *"Contemporary Issues in the Development of Caribbean Economies"* with Dr. Sandra Schrouder and Dr. Donna Cooke.

Dr. Rhodd is very active in the community. He has served as the president and treasurer of Wolmer's Alumni Association, the president and treasurer of the University of the West Indies Alumni Association and is currently the co-director of the Coalition of Jamaican Alumni Associations of Florida (The Coalition), the umbrella organization that he and Dr. Sandra Schrouder founded in 2008. The Coalition was created to assist in the dissemination of information about Jamaican alumni associations registered in the State of Florida, and to help in the unification and streamlining of activities of these associations. Through the publication of a monthly newsletter (The Coalition Monthly) and its website ([www.cjaaf.info](http://www.cjaaf.info)), the Coalition keeps the Jamaican community in Florida informed about matters pertaining to Jamaican alumni associations in Florida, and issues relating to the development of education in Jamaica. Through the Coalition, Dr. Rhodd and Dr. Schrouder have donated computer equipment and school supplies to numerous schools in Jamaica, and funded a water tank project in Jamaica. The Coalition's current "barrel of books" initiative has already benefitted one primary school in Jamaica, and the goal is to send books to at least one primary school in each parish.

For the past nine years, the Coalition has organized an annual walkathon on the first Saturday in December. This is used by the alumni associations to raise funds for their alma mater, other projects in Jamaica, and projects in the local community. This year's walkathon is on December 7, 2019 and will take place at Central Broward Regional Park in Lauderhill from 8:30 AM to 2:00 PM.

Dr. Rhodd has served on the Planning and Zoning Board of the City of Parkland and is currently a member of the Advisory Board of the City of Parkland.

**Dr. Allan Cunningham:** Born and raised in Rose Town, Kingston, Jamaica, Dr. Allan Cunningham is a self-taught business entrepreneur who started at the age of 8 years old when he first started selling Kisko pops in downtown Kingston. A product of Whitfield All Age and Camperdown High School, Dr. Cunningham has truly demonstrated the virtues of community enrichment by giving back to both schools and fostering an environment of assistance. As a proud past student of Camperdown High School, he has contributed to the Florida Chapter of Camperdown Past Students' Association by serving as vice president, and president for 8 years. Dr. Cunningham is also a Board member of the Parent Community Task Force of the Broward County School Board and currently serves on the board of the Coalition of Jamaican Alumni Associations of Florida.

Dr. Cunningham's love for the community and its people led to the creation and development of the People Profile Organization for persons to share their personal life stories with the express purpose of educating, inspiring and motivating others. This idea also led to the birth of the pinnacle award ceremony in South Florida, the People Profile Awards that recognize ordinary people doing extraordinary things. Funds earned from the organization has been used to assist needy students, support school feeding programs, and given to other charitable ventures.

For more than 20 years, Dr. Cunningham has built a reputation of achieving exceptional results as an International Trade Consultant. Between 2008/2012, Dr. Cunningham served with Green Wealth International as their Senior International Business Consultant and Global Strategic Analyst. His academic achievement includes a Doctorate in International Business, Masters in Management and Psychology, and a Bachelors in Psychology with a focus on Family Therapy and Substance Abuse education.

He is married to his wife Judith and the family has six beautiful daughters and a granddaughter.



## UWI CLIMBS TO TOP 4% IN WORLD RANKING

At a media conference hosted at The University of the West Indies (the UWI) Cave Hill campus on Thursday, Vice Chancellor Professor Sir Hilary Beckles announced that the regional university had climbed the Times Higher Education (THE) rankings, following its debut last year.

Not only has the UWI retained its position as the number one-ranked university in the Latin America and Caribbean region, it moved from the top three per cent to the top two per cent.

The scores for its global rankings show that it moved from the top five per cent to the top four per cent of ranked universities.

“This upward trajectory into the top four per cent of the world's best universities reflects the extraordinary effort of the management team and the UWI family to honour the pledge within the strategic plan to be an excellent global university rooted in the Caribbean,” said Beckles. He added: “It is the intention of the university to be located in the top three per cent of ranked universities by the end of the current strategic planning cycle in 2023.”

UWI is the only Caribbean university on the 2020 list, which features almost 1,400 universities across 92 countries. “The university has experienced a considerable rise in self-confidence since participating in these global rankings,” the vice chancellor said. “The UWI has an excellent executive management team, and is focused on sustaining its reputation revolution while demonstrating daily proof of greater efficiency and public accountability.” UWI's project team is lead by Pro Vice Chancellor Densil Williams.

Describing the ranking process, Williams made the comparison that for the 2019 World University Rankings, there were 1,258 universities on the list, (The UWI placed at 591), while for the 2020 World University Rankings 1,397 universities made the list (the UWI came in at 571).

“The UWI has moved significantly up the trajectory,” he said. He further noted that the UWI has seen significant movement in all THE's criteria of teaching, research, citations, industry income and international outlook. Importantly, the regional university, which is much smaller and less-resourced than many of its competitors on the list, received very high scores for 'citations' and 'international outlook' — placing it among the top 75 percentile of universities across the globe in those criteria.

“I am very confident,” he stated, “that going forward the UWI will see better days. And given what we now know about our global university and the quality of work that we have been doing, I expect us to continue to rise in the near future.

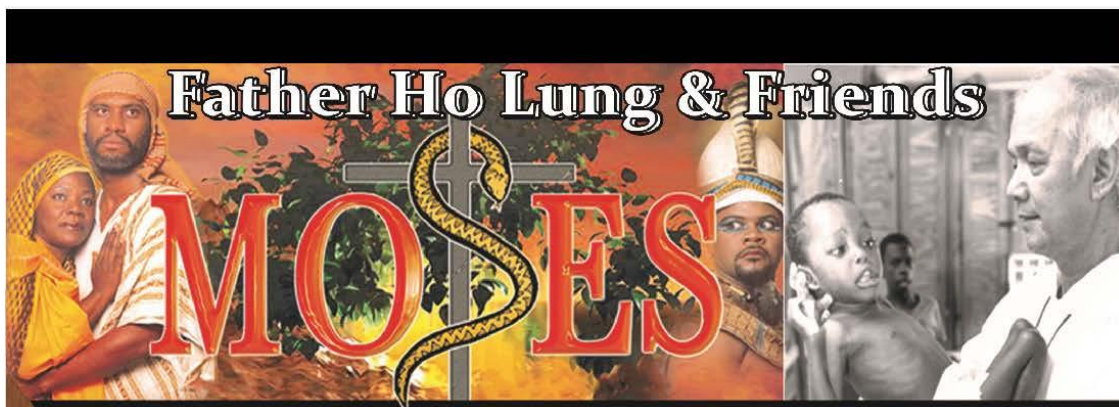
